## **CANADA'S PREMIERE NEW WORKS FESTIVAL RETURNS FEBRUARY 2008.**

Buddies in Bad Times Theatre proudly announces the return of the Rhubarb Festival, following a one-year hiatus. At this year's Rhubarb Festival, Buddies is offering close to one hundred participating artists (including **Hannah Moscovitch, Jess Dobkin, David Storch, Natasha Mytnowych, Shawn Hitchins, Jacob Wren, Erika Batdorf, Gil Garratt, Shannon Cochrane** and **Sean MacMahon**) a critic-free environment in which to play and experiment -- and, after suffering through a 'Rhubarb-Free' 2007, we are dying to sample this year's bounty!

Toronto theatregoers are invited to shake off those mid-winter blues and spend a cozy evening at Buddies in Bad Times Theatre's 12 Alexander Street digs. Rhubarb is a great chance to catch one-of-a-kind performances, cruise installations, meet the artists, socialize and dance the night away in Tallulah's Cabaret. Audience members are encouraged to see as many shows as they can in one night or to take their time, and come back again and again. Canada's premier new works festival is notorious for showcasing the most outrageous acts you'll catch all year-round, and Festival Director **Erika Hennebury** promises that this year is no exception. The 29<sup>th</sup> Rhubarb Festival line-up features radical new hybrids of dance, theatre, video, stand-up, musical theatre, opera, animation, storytelling and rock 'n' roll - *all under one roof*. Once in the door, you're in for a wild ride.

### **Returns with a Bang: The Rhubarb Festival Kick Off Bash**

Rhubarb officially returns on **Wednesday February 20**, with the unveiling of Week One shows (beginning at 8pm), and the **Rhubarb Festival Kick-Off Bash**, hosted by the one and only tap-dancing drag superstar, **Keith Cole**. This year's Rhubarb Festival Kick-Off Bash begins at 10:30pm with a special screening of Cole's **Rhubarb Video Project: *Vegetable or Fruit? Weed, Stalk or Root?*** (created from 2006 festival footage, and starring a bevy of theatre folk from Shaw Festival's Jerry Doiron and The Theatre Centre's Franco Boni, through to Buddies' founder Sky Gilbert and Festival Director Erika Hennebury), followed by special musical guest stars performing in Tallulah's Cabaret (line-up TBA), and the stylings of DJ **Shane MacKinnon**.

### **Week One Overview**

Each night of Week One (Feb 20-24) will feature presentations of brand new works created by **Erika Batdorf, Gideon Arthurs, Shawn Hitichins, One Reed Theatre** and Winnipeg's **Ian Mozdzen**. Solo & Mini-Stage devisors scattered throughout Week One include **Evan Tapper, Andrew Scorer, David Oiyee, Chad Dembski, J.P. Robichaud, Allison Cummings, Jesse Stong, Chelsea McMullan, Cole J Alvis, Andrea Donaldson, Gil Garrat, Mary Beath Badian, Ian Carpenter**, and more. Week One also features the **Friday Late-Night Shorts** (Fri Feb 22, 10:30pm), a cabaret of short performances by **Jess Dobkin, Chy Ryan Spain, Allison Peacock, Lindsey Gillard** and Montreal's **PME-ART (Caroline Dubois, Claudia Fancello & Jacob Wren)**. Week One Festivities are rounded out by staged readings of new plays by **Michael Reynolds** and **Mark Shyzer**, participants in Buddies' **Young Creators' Unit** (Sat Feb 23, 7pm).

## Week Two Overview

Each night of Week Two (Feb 27–Mar 2) will feature presentations of brand new works created by Vancouver's the memelab (Jesse Scott and Mirae Rosner), Christopher Stanton, Norman Lup-Man Yeung, Hannah Moscovitch and Sean MacMahon. Solo & Mini-Stage devisors scattered throughout Week Two include J.P. Robichaud, Sam Stedman, Alexis Butler, Shannon Cochrane, Alistair Newton, Sherri Hay, David Bateman, Trevor Schwellnus, Ken MacKenzie, David Oiyee, Tobaron Waxman, The Problem Guy and more. Week Two also features a special one time presentation of *It's a Matter of Scale: The Nuclear Revolution (Dedicated to the Revolutions Part Six)*, created and performed by Small Wooden Shoe, directed by Jacob Zimmer (Fri Feb 29, 10:30pm). Week Two Festivities are rounded out by staged readings of new plays by Alisha Stranges and Jordan Tannahill, participants in Buddies' Young Creators' Unit (Sat Mar 1, 7PM).

## About Rhubarb

The Rhubarb Festival was first produced by Buddies in Bad Times Theatre in 1979, and is Canada's oldest festival of new Canadian theatre. The Rhubarb Festival is more than a festival; it is a commentary on theatre - on how we create it, on how we present it, and on how we experience it. Here we allow the *artist* and the *idea* to be the centre of attention. The trappings of traditional theatre are purged in favour of a stripped-down approach, where inspiration and invention are genesis. For almost 30 years The Rhubarb Festival has acted as a seeding ground for exciting new work from a host of groundbreaking Canadian artists, including Sky Gilbert, Daniel MacIvor, Daniel Brooks, Guillermo Verdecchia, Don McKellar, Diane Flacks, Gavin Crawford, Sonja Mills, Darren O'Donnell, Damien Atkins, Atom Egoyan, Jacob Wren, Ann-Marie MacDonald (and many more). And above all, Rhubarb is one helluva good time.
